

Dear Athletes and Friends,

On behalf of the Board of Directors, we would like to offer our congratulations on your participation in the 15th presentation of the Big Sur International Marathon and its related events.

Running in unseasonably warm conditions, Esteban Vanegas, originally from Ecuador and currently living in Michigan, captured his first ever BSIM crown with a winning time of 2:27:06. At mile 20 he pulled away from competitors Sergey Nochnev of Russia and John Kipkoskei of New Mexico and never looked back. The women's race was much closer, with Russian Natalia Solominskaia winning in a time of 2:46:53, closely followed by countrywoman Elvira Kolpakova. Kari Distefano of Colorado finished third. All spoke of the heat and the difficulty of the final six miles of the course.

Overall this year's event attracted a field of 9,665 runners and walkers, a new BSIM record. The Marathon had 3,741 registered entrants. There were 2,632 finishers, with 2,514 finishing within the five and a half-hour time limit. The 118 runners who completed their run after the course had closed are recorded as post five and one half hour finishers.

There were 2,173 runners and walkers from outside California, representing 48 states, with Texas, New York, Washington, Oregon, Colorado, Florida and Illinois all registering between 100-160 runners each. Canada led the foreign category with 169 entrants. In all, 29 countries were represented.

Once more the Big Sur International Marathon received unparalleled co-operation and support from CALTRANS, Monterey County Supervisors, the cities of Carmel, Monterey, Pacific Grove, Seaside, Marina and Sand City. We also extend our thanks to the communities of Big Sur, Palo Colorado Canyon and the Carmel Highlands as well as to the students and staff of the Defense Language Institute. Our corps of 2,000 volunteers come to us from all over Monterey County and it is only due to their generous contribution of time and energy that we are able to enjoy our continued success.

Supporting us from Big Sur to Carmel before, during and after the race are our loyal and devoted sponsors. We thank those of you who took the time to drop them a note of appreciation, for they are directly responsible for the extra care we are able to give our runners and walkers throughout the course of the race weekend.

Special recognition also goes to our Grizzled Vets who have started and finished all fifteen BSIMs. May your streak remain unbroken!

Our mission is to produce a truly first class event on the most spectacular 26.2 mile course in the world. According to your letters, e-mails and report cards, we succeeded. We hope in 2001 that you will again take on the challenge of the Big Sur International Marathon and enjoy the splendor of running on the edge of the western world.







The second year of the Big Sur International Marathon Training Clinic was a huge success, with the number of both participants and finishers up from the year before. More than 217 people attended at least one of the sessions, with about 110 "regulars" and the same number of finishers. Of this group, 75 were first time marathoners and 10 had never even run before. The clinics were held every two weeks, beginning in November, and a pizza party following the Marathon was the culmination of six months of training tips and advice offered in the clinics. Participants were schooled by both experts and local runners on the long run, speed work, Galloway Run-Walk technique, women's issues, stretching and injury prevention, equipment and clothing, icing, resistance training and how to tackle and survive the Big Sur course. Various incentives were provided at the clinics in the form of refreshments, courtesy of the Community

Hospital of the Monterey Peninsula, and discounts on clothing and shoes were given by The Treadmill. Turtle Bay Taqueria also provided Turtle "bucks", a nice discount on some healthy food. There were two group runs offered, complete with aid stations, GU and post-run refreshments, which were well attended.

The final session of the clinic proves that one saves the best for last. The success stories of the finishers were both emotional and motivational, with tears and smiles an integral part of the evening. Among those who completed the Marathon were two men over 70 years old, one 64-year-old grandmother of 22, one legally blind runner and 2 who placed and won prizes in their age groups despite being "first timers." Despite sore legs, most of these newly converted marathoners were looking forward to next year's race.


Water? Gatorade? Vaseline?


